In 2002, Charlie Hunter suffers PTSD and survivor's guilt after being the only firefighter found alive inside a stairwell after the collapse of the World Trade Center.

He discovers the firefighters' pension fund has been ripped off in a Ponzi scheme orchestrated by ruthless financier CW Gier—the same financial genius the fund-vetting committee—which included Charlie, it turns out—hired.

The firefighters launch a class action suit based on the testimony of Gier's former accountant turned whistleblower Darlene Lindy.

Charlie, a widower, falls in love with Darlene, vows to protect her as he notices Gier's bodyguards following her.

With enormous wealth and power, Gier bribes the lawmakers and has the whistleblower murdered.
